There is insufficient integration of the different hospice and palliative care services into the Austrian health caer plan and social security system. The responsibilities are not clear enough, financing is not assured and access is not equal.

Financing of palliative care services in Austria is heterogenous. While palliative care units are supported nationwide by the National Health System and financed within the framework of the social security system other services such as hospices and mobile palliative care services are not. They rely on variable support of provinces and communities, varying patients co-payments or private institutions and donations
