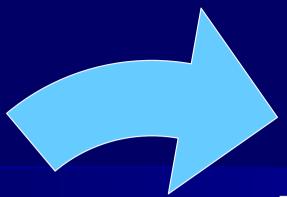

Challenges to setting up a multidisciplinary research group

- People –attracting the 'right' people, staff retention, getting the right skill mix.
- Research career develop is poorly organised and funded.
- Working in teams conflict, time consuming
- Multidisciplinary professional boundaries and values
- Leadership attracting the 'right' person.
- Funding little and competitive, changing whims of funders.
- Managing changes in personnel, focus and responding to social and political changes.
